Note: "X" is a camera currently (and permanently) in Mike Roman's custody. Mike borrowed the camera and replaced it with a different one. The camera on Mike's list is tag#103606, but is incorrectly identified in the property database as having been purchased on PO # 569461. There were two cameras on that PO, and these are clearly (3) and (4) which have sequential FNAL tag numbers and very nearby Basler serial numbers. Mike's camera was purchased earlier on PO# 563685. Camera (4) has a fermilab tag number, but does not appear as an entry in the property database.

Note: Reqs 180094 and 569461 identify the Basler Camera as "video camera" and are purchased under "video equipment and supplies." These cameras are tagged sensitive items. Req 194179 identifies the Basler camera as simply "Basler camera" and classifies it as "electronics equipment." These four cameras are not tagged and not sensitive. The camera purchased by Mike Roman is identified as a camera and classified as "misc materials and supplies." It is tagged
